



Report of meeting held at School of Economic Science, 11 Mandeville Place, London W1U 3AJ

Present: Peter (chair), Eddie, Trevor, Ellena, Michael, Pete, Steve, Mary (notes)

Go-round, Pete talks about work he is doing: The Right of Self-Determination - David Williams

Peter defines chaplaincy as working one to one, 3-gear mission, intimate, corporate, global, Michael engages with him on this. Need to refer to work already done, Peter refers us to the house chart. All life has an integrity that is moving and flowing.

Michael says “reality is flowing” means that our perception of reality is abstracted to some extent, hierarchies are the way our minds work, how to deal with the paradox, it’s not that human thought systems are flawed, they are all we’ve got, it’s our perception is an abstraction, and we have to cope with that.

Pete says in Gnosticism you have to see how our thoughts and feelings express themselves, looking at mythology, it’s understanding the psychology, the abstracts that are used against us to trap our hearts and minds. If you don’t know it’s happening you are unaware, if you can see the pattern of what is being used against you. If you know yourself as an individual, you don’t need the priest. Anarchy is coming from a ruler, terminology from the Old Mystery Schools. If we had anarchy individually our energy would be directed to virtue rather than vice.

Why worship is important is engaging with others, mutual learning. **Michael** says we do need meaning, rules, structures, without that we would just go bonkers; bringing up children is teaching them the rules, they need the security of love, on the basis of the rules, manageable, abstracted, controllable world, they understand how to manage it: we need rules, we need to develop an awareness of what we are doing when we give meaning to reality.

Peter talks about governance, subsidiarity, his worry.....

Michael says the rules are inherent

Pete says that anarchy is to do not with rules but with rulers. We have duties and obligations, but using the correct terms. Anarchy has got nothing to do....

Peter asks Eddie’s view in relation to art, Artists in general after leap into abstraction still seem to present their work in these confined areas, they have not take the abstraction as to how it’s presented.

Pete refers to Karl Rove of the CIA saying once we have the population believing what is false this becomes the reality - https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=IHvNYwk_LKA Aldous Huxley, Alistair Crowley, and Carlos Castaneda were working for the establishment, i.e. cultural icons helped build a cage in society. It was all directed by the Tavistock Institute, Institute of International Affairs, working towards the situation where we are now. People were more together, when you undermine society it allows for break-up of society, commodifying everything..... Mozart worked with rules, resolution of freedom and regulation, made us aware of the place of rules in art.

Eddie says it was a blueprint for society where structure is disseminated.

Michael says are you knocking role-modeling.... the system

Peter says there's a hierarchy of function,

Anarchy means no ego as individuals, in the Mystery Schools, it is an internal thing, not ruled by your vices, and you are aware of the needs of others, not just self, "altruism". Peter says does this apply to education (trained) there are rulers, but rich servant-leaders. If you are loved you can respond to guidelines. Pete says if you can understand your own psychology.... Richard Forman, says it's not new ideas, it's new places to put new ideas, developing new spaces,

Michael, re nurture, love, rules, behaviour implicit in their behaviour. Adult societies need examples, we need written rules, delicate balance of awareness. We have to present this to the general public ... What are constitutionalists doing, trying to impose rules, suggest, giving options, let's not achieve our new system by being negative about the old one,

Ellena says the banking commission, see Mansion House speech, Mark Carni, new Lord Mayor

Michael asks what will the Greens do when they get into power, existing system, a sanitised version, are they radically against it, or in favour of the system but sanitise parts of it? **Trevor** says we have parliamentary representative democracy, and **Michael** says yes this is all we've got, based on a two-party system which no longer works, the system needs to be more inclusive, and less adversarial.

Michael says surely there should be some collaboration with the Greens.

Trevor talks about Caroline Lucas criticising the Green Council's performance in her local area.

Michael talks about housing, e.g. security of tenure is mentioned in the Green Party manifesto.

He says that collective planning can work, it was the only policy manifesto which remotely tackles the issues we are dealing with. We need to get the Greens instituted in Constitutionalism.

Peter says one of the issues we have to deal with is collaboration, not continually breaking into egoism, in order to discuss, and this personal skill of meeting in genuine dialogue. The paper he put together with collaborative ideas is useful.

Michael asks how far the Greens are concerned with the democratic deficit.
